Upon entering the park, your first stop will be at the concession stand where the children will receive a Halloween goody bag from our elected officials and village hall staff; there will be additional stops with treats from our departments along the way before exiting the park. Please note, we are asking that everyone remain in their vehicles throughout the “drive-thru” for everyone’s safety. Don’t forget to wear your costume so we can get plenty of pictures and then you’ll be ready to go Trick-or-Treating in town from 6:00-8:00 p.m. Residents that wish to pass out candy at their home, please leave your front/porch light on so the children know they are welcome at your home. General Election

Don’t forget that Tuesday, November 5 is the Presidential General Election. Polls will be open in the Ralph Contipelli Civic Center (lower level) of the village hall from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. This election will decide The President and Vice-President of the United States, US Senate, US Congress, Ohio Senate, Ohio House, county council and judicial seats as well as state, county and local issues. Voters are encouraged to view a sample ballot on the Board of Elections website because there are at least six pages of candidates and issues that need to be read carefully to ensure the ballot is voted properly. Some of the text is printed on more than one page of the double-sided ballots.



Tuesday, November 5

If you have moved or changed your name since you last voted, you must complete a new registration form to reflect your new address and/or new name. Voter registration forms must be postmarked 30 days before an election in order to be eligible to vote. The registration form, as well as the “Vote by Mail” applications, are available for our residents at the village hall during normal business hours. You can also go online at boe.cuyahogacounty.gov and fill out the forms. If you need additional information, the board of elections’ phone number is (216) 443-8683.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Halloween can be a fun holiday for kids, but a worrisome one for parents. Concerns about children's safety—whether they are out in the neighborhood or back home with bags of booty—can darken the day more quickly than a black cat. But not to worry! To make Halloween a treat, follow these safety tips.

ADULTS

- Make sure the path to your door is clear, welcome trick-or-treaters with your porch lights and turn on any exterior lights.

Report any suspicious or criminal activity to your police department immediately.

MOTORISTS

- Exercise extreme caution when driving a vehicle. Be on the alert for excited youngsters, who may have limited vision due to their costumes. They may dart unexpectedly into traffic.

DRIVE SOBER!

MAKE TRICK-OR-TREATING TROUBLE FREE:

- Create a map of a safe trick-or-treating route and set a time limit for your children to "trick-or-treat."
- Trick-or-treaters should always be in groups so they are not a tempting target for real-life goblins.
- **Parents should accompany young children.**
- Make sure older kids trick-or-treat with friends. Together, map out a safe route so you will know where they are going. Tell them to stop only at familiar homes where the outside lights are on.
- Try to get your kids to trick-or-treat while it is still light out. If it is dark, make sure someone has a flashlight, add reflective tape to costumes and bags, and pick well-lit streets.
- **Do not go inside anyone's home.** Remain on the porch at all times.
- Do not accept rides from strangers and be sure children do not approach any vehicle, occupied or not.
- Cross only at street corners, never between parked cars, and never diagonally across an intersection.
- Look in all directions before crossing the street and obey all traffic signals. **Walk! Never run across the street and use sidewalks (not the street) for walking.**
- Do not take shortcuts through back yards, alleys or parks.
- Teach children how to call 9-1-1 in an emergency.

CHECK ALL TREATS BEFORE EATING:

- It is hard for kids to hold back from eating their treats until they get home. One way to keep trick-or-treaters from digging into their loot is to feed them a meal or a snack beforehand.
- Do not eat any treats until an adult has inspected them.
- Discard any homemade or unwrapped treats.
- Check out all candy in a well-lit place when your trick-or-treater gets home.
- What to eat? Only unopened candies and other treats that are in original wrappers. Don't forget to inspect fruit and homemade goodies for anything suspicious.

Halloween can be great fun for parents and kids alike—but only if everybody remembers the tricks and treats of playing it safe.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR FIRE CHIEF, MIKE SUHY



BE HALLOWEEN Safe

Halloween is a fun, and spooky, time of year for kids. Make trick-or-treating safe for your little monsters with a few easy safety tips.

HALLOWEEN FIRE SAFETY TIPS

- »» **When choosing a costume**, stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he or she can see out.
- »» **Provide children** with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- »» Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper catch fire easily. **Keep all decorations** away from open flames and other heat sources like light bulbs and heaters.
- »» **Use a battery-operated** candle or glow-stick in jack-o-lanterns. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of the way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.
- »» **Remember** to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- »» **Make sure** all smoke alarms in the home are working.
- »» **Tell children** to stay away from open flames including jack-o-lanterns with candles in them. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. (Have them practice, stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.)

If your children are going to **Halloween parties** at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.

Did you know?



Decorations are the first thing to ignite in roughly **800** reported home fires each year. More than one-third of these fires were started by a candle.

VILLAGE SERVICES



Garbage Pick Up – Recycling – Yard Waste

Our service department collects garbage every Monday morning beginning at 8:00 a.m. at no charge to its residents. They will come into your yard and take your garbage tote and recycling container to the curb; afterwards they will carry it back into your yard. Please note that if a holiday falls on a Monday; the service will commence on Tuesday.



New Yard Waste Cans – All Resident Homes

The Service Department will distribute a new waste can to each resident home specifically designated for yard waste. These cans will be labeled as YARD WASTE and should only be used for that purpose. We kindly ask that the cans do not exceed 50 lbs when filled, and please avoid placing wet grass clippings or large tree branches inside. Any sticks or branches that are too large to fit should be cut into 4-foot pieces and bundled together for easier collection. Additional cans are available for purchase at \$50 each. If you have any questions or would like to buy an extra yard waste can, please contact the Service Department at 216-641-3505. *New yard waste cans are scheduled to be delivered the week of October 7th, 2024*



Special Pick Up – **NOW ONLINE!**

If you need a special pick up for trash that is oversized, large amounts, or hazardous waste, you can now go online to be put on the special pick up list. Special pick up day is on Tuesday mornings, unless there is a holiday on Monday, at which time, the special pick up will be taken care of on Wednesday. You must submit your information by 4:00 p.m. on Monday to get on the list for Tuesday's pick up. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Special Pick Up' tab. Please fill out your name, address, and all information regarding items you would like to be picked up and where they are located. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. **If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.**



Charity Pick Up – **NOW ONLINE!**

Our service department will pick up any small usable item at your residence that you would like to donate to charity on the first Wednesday of each month. Small household items, clothes, etc., are collected and donated. No tax receipts are given for this service. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Charity Pick Up' tab. Please enter your address and select from the drop down. Fill out your name, phone number, email address and all information regarding items you would like to donate and where items are located. This must be submitted prior to the first Wednesday of the month for this service. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. **If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.**



Dumpsters – **NOW ONLINE!**

Residents may rent a village dumpster for personal use at their home by paying \$30.00 to the village for each dumpster load. Dumpsters can be used for yard waste, construction debris or miscellaneous household items NOT including carpet, tires, or hazardous waste. Please do not mix materials. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Dumpster Rental' tab. Provide your information and select a preferred delivery date for the dumpster & specify the location for placement. You can now conveniently pay the fee online through a link that will be sent to your email. You also can drop off cash or check payments at village hall. Use of the dumpster is for a maximum of two (2) weeks. After two (2) weeks, the dumpster will be picked up from the resident's home. If the resident needs to use it again, he/she will go back on the waiting list. Please note that the disposal of debris created from outside the village is prohibited.

Newspaper/Cardboard Recycling

Do your part in helping the environment; recycle cardboard and newspaper. Our village has a recycling container located at Bacci Park in the rear of the back parking lot. The container is strictly for cardboard and newspaper. Please make sure to break down your cardboard boxes before placing them in the container. Stop on down and do your part in recycling. If you have a large amount and are unable to take it to the container, please call the service department during normal business hours prior to Tuesday mornings; we will put it on our "special pick up" list.



Pest and Insect Control

Pest control services are available by contacting our service department at 216-641-3505 with your name, address, phone number, and the nature of your problem. We will then reach out to our pest control vendor. This service is free except for termites, bed bugs, and wildlife. The village also sprays the outside of your home in the spring to hinder any unwanted pests from entering your home.



Meals on Wheels (By Lori's Custom Catering) – **NOW ONLINE!**

Visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Meals On Wheels' tab to fill out an application. This service is available to any village resident that is 60 years of age or older. A lunchtime meal will be delivered to your home daily, Monday through Friday, by our service department. This is an affordable option, the cost is \$25.00 per week, which is only \$5.00 per day (*you must sign-up up for a full week.*) To receive meals for a given week, payment must be made by the Thursday prior. **If you have any questions regarding this service, please contact Vera at the service department at 216-641-3505 or sd@cuyahogaheights.com.**



Tree Trimming/Removal Service – **NOW ONLINE!**

The village will provide a professional tree trimmer to remove or trim a tree on a resident's property. Please note that tree trimming/removal is limited to two (2) trims per year and one (1) removal. If a crane is needed for tree removal, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for the service. In addition, if a stump needs ground, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for this service, whether the homeowner uses the tree company that the village has a contract with or another tree company. Table & Chair Rental

A limited number of tables and chairs are available for use by residents having parties at their residence, free of charge. Please contact the service department at 216-641-3505 to reserve your tables and chairs and to arrange a time when you can pick them up.
